- 1. Review Prior Meeting Minutes Not done Abbie sent minutes.. will revisit in April 2021 meeting.
- 2. COVID 19 update
 - From Conor Gorman: Vaccine update: more happening. No timeline for moving into the new Borough Hall, some staff are in.
 - Ongoing conversation re: storage space for DSTC materials.
 - April will still be remote meetings for DSTC, May will be at Arboretum (current plan)
- 3. Discussion of homeowner issues/questions (if any)
 - Discussion of Sidewalk issues w/ Conor and how the issues have to be homeowner problems unless an immediate safety concern (New Milford & Bedford tree had to come down, sidewalk fixed) but Berkeley, kept tree and homeowner redid sidewalk around the tree which was healthy.
- 4. Proposal / discussion of memorial tree

Joe Reissner invited to discuss planting at Memorial Park. Joe representing the DHS class of 1988 lost a classmate to Covid-19. Kristen Bunel (there is a GoFund me) She grew up in Dumont, park was favorite hangout. The class wants to honor/memorialize her with a 'purple flowering, if possible) tree and a plaque in the park off Charles Street. Eastern Redbud proposed, 1-2" caliper, 5-6' height. Class DHS'88 would raise all funds, volunteer to care and help plant, water. Commission voted unanimously to agree to planting this tree for Kristen.

- Ray proposed that the DSTC plant a tree (maybe a grove of trees?) in town TBD for those lost to Covid19. Discussion and suggestions include a large tree in Memorial Park, Arboretum, other ideas? Want to make it a significant presence in town to future generations to help remember and honor all we lost b/c of the pandemic.
