- 1. **Review prior meeting minutes**-Kathy says they are not finished and she will owe for January and February at the next meeting.
- 2. **Discussion of Homeowner issues** No homeowners are present. Tom has checked a tree at 100 Dixon. He says we will monitor the tree.
- 3. Arbor Day 2016- There is a discussion on past years t-shirts. Abbie in the past has checked with 3 places and gotten bids and picked the lowest. She feels that the way to save money is to limit who gets the backpack/t-shirt. It will save us to give only to contest entrants and winners. Kathy has a sample of the string backpack and Abbie says it should be polyester otherwise printing is difficult. We also have to get the sponsor flier circulated. 6. Arboretum-

- a. Help with Maintenance of the arboretum- Bill says he will notify people of a meeting in March. 6 of the 11 beds have someone who will take care of them. The large bed on Madison Ave needs maintenance. We will check to see if the sponsor of the bed from the Recreation flower bed program is still going to maintain it. Otherwise we may have another landscaper who would want to do it. Bill and Ray say the sign is old and could be updated. Maybe something along the lines of the sign at the Dawn Totten park. We need to work on having the DPW take the weeds away when that starts. As far as brick installation before Arbor Day it is decided to not rush the installation. We will display them on a table like we did last year.
- Update from FOTST- They had their annual meeting in January. Sally gave out the financial form. Tom would like to have in reserve 5 years of annual costs and fees. - 9. Tree Maintenance- Tom says it is slow right now. It will pick up in the summer.

- 11. **Other-** Ray says our 5 year plan expired in December of 2015. We have to the end of 2016 to have our new plan submitted. Ray asks everyone to think of something ambitious that we would like to accomplish. How about planting 1.000 trees. Abbie has a question on how many trees have been taken down and how many have been planted. Less than half of the trees taken down have been replaced. When we plant trees we need people to take care of them for the first two years. They need to be watered.
