Heroin use during pregnancy can result in neonatal Abstinence syndrome (NAS). NAS occurs when heroin passes through the placenta to the fetus during Pregnancy, causing the baby to become dependent along with the mother.

Because it enters the brain so rapidly, heroin is particularly addictive, both psychologically and the physically. Heroin users report feeling a surge of euphoria or feeling, followed by a twilight state of sleep and wakefulness.
