- All contestants agree to allow their entry to be displayed on the DSTC Facebook page, Instagram account and website. An image of the poster may be included in other publications, free or for sale, for the benefit of the Dumont Shade Tree Commission.
- DSTC reserves the right to return or not accept any submission it deems not acceptable or does not follow the rules.
- Artwork may be any size. Just keep in mind that the artwork will need to be photographed and emailed.
